Jerry King Chappell, 83, of Bernhard's Bay, passed away on Saturday, August 19, 2023. Born in Louisville, KY, he served in the US Army and Reserves for nine years including one year in Okinawa.

From 1961, the majority of his work history revolved around RADAR technology including General Electric, Rome Research Labs, Lockheed Martin and ICM. In the 1970's, he was a motor boat/snowmobile sales and service shop owner in Spruce Grove.
